### **Minutes:**

1. Review of minutes - Connie Kraus noted that her name as a committee member was omitted from the IHC Annual Report. The Chair humbly apologizes and will amend the Annual Report.
2. Dr. George Mejicano, Associate Professor of Medicine and Assistant Dean for Continuing Medical Education and Katy Duren, Assistant Dean of Continuing Studies, presented information to the committee about Extended Day and Credit Outreach proposals. There was extensive discussion. The committee will notify faculty who are teaching Interprofessional courses of the availability of these programs. Future action by the committee will be discussed at a later time.

6. Faculty rewards survey responses – Mary Bumann shared the results of her survey which indicated that the primary reward as viewed by faculty is support of the work itself.

7. Tamara Axelson asked that a meeting be convened to brainstorm for cases that the students could begin to use as practice for the case competition which will occur in early February. J. Banning and/or M. Bumann will meet with the student group.
8. Visit from Liz Taylor in 2006 – Dr. Taylor is not an actress, but rather a psychologist from the University of Alberta who will be visiting the US and would like to come to UW. She presented a paper at the Interprofessional Education meeting in Vancouver in May entitled “Creating an Active Learning Environment by Developing Community and Faculty Facilitators for an Interdisciplinary Team Development Course.” M. Bumann will continue to stay in touch with her for this planning.
